University: Widening Participation (some of the criteria universities use to assess eligibility are: household income, receipt of free-school meals/sixth form bursary, first generation in a family to attend university and living in an area with low progression rates to university). Schemes often result in students receiving a slightly lower offer from the university.

Supported Progression – Durham University

Supported Progression (SP) is a programme for Year 12 students. Some students who have the potential to study with at Durham Uni will benefit from extra help and support. The Uni aim to give these students the chance to show their potential in a different way. By passing the assessed summer school project, you can work toward a guaranteed, conditional offer from as well as developing your academic skills.

As an SP student, you will have the opportunity to attend events and activities during Years 12 and 13. You'll learn about Durham and all there is on offer. Durham students need a few key personal skills to succeed at university, such as presentation skills, budgeting, time management, and so on! Their aim is to ensure you go through the scheme and come out the other side confident and assured of your own ability.
