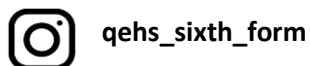




We ask students and their parents to research fully any opportunities advertised in the bulletin to ensure they are happy with the organisation they are linking with and its value for money if there is a cost.

On 5th February, we examine Aggregate Demand with Dr James Watson, Associate Professor in Financial Economics in the School of Economics at University of East Anglia.

Aiming to understand together what contributes to the wealth of our economy, the challenges the UK economy faces, and what our policymakers can do to help, James will discuss what aggregate demand is; what affects the components of aggregate demand; and what this means for policymakers, including the challenges and trade-offs they face.
