Lockdown evacuation practice

As part of our approach to ensuring all children, staff and visitors are safe on the school site, we have a lockdown procedure. This is common for all schools and provides information on what we would do in the event of a situation where the school was required to go into lockdown. A lockdown might be required for several reasons: for example, an incident in the wider community where it is decided that we would be safer to keep people secure on site; an environmental incident such as a large fire nearby and concern of the impact of fumes meaning people need to stay indoors; or an animal or intruder on site.

On Monday 7th April, we will be doing a walkthrough of a lockdown procedure with staff and pupils. This drill will allow everyone to understand the procedure. Staff are already aware of the lockdown procedure, but we will talk it through with pupils in the coming weeks, along with details of how the walkthrough will work. The walkthrough will be handled carefully, and pupils will be prepared in advance and helped to understand why we have such safety procedures.

Our decision to carry out a walkthrough of our lockdown procedure is to ensure that staff and pupils are clear on the expectations and does not reflect a change to the level of any risk or threat to the school. If you or your child have any specific questions or concerns, please contact the school, or suggest your child speaks to their form teacher. The SEND team will be working with pupils who may need more support in advance or during the walkthrough.

It attracts top club and school crews from across the country, with over 2000 competitors racing across a range of categories.

The crew competed in the J16 championship 8+ category, seeing QEHS Rowing Club crew compete against the premier J16 crews from across the country. They finished 13th in their category and 86th overall out of over 300 crews.

LRC Recommended Read


This week's LRC recommended read is Blood Flowers by Jay McGuiness
