

QEHS WEEKLY UPDATE 32

After half term, Y11 and Y13 students will be on study leave. During the first week back, the normal timetable will run for Y9, Y10 and Y12. There will be trips out of school in Madrid and Kenya. We will also welcome Mrs Laura Warland who will be assuming her role as Assistant Head Teacher SENDCo on Monday 2 June.

In the second week (week beginning 9 June) it will be REA week. There will be a different timetable for students in Y9 and Y10 who will be involved in a range of activities linked to careers, sport, STEM and life skills. Students will receive details after half term. During that week Y12 students will be out of school on work experience. On Monday 16 June, the students will move to their new timetable.

Sustainability and climate action planning

Over the course of this year, certain staff across Hadrian Learning Trust have been working with government-funded external advisors and others to develop a climate action plan that will in time enable our schools to become more sustainable, as part of the wider national drive towards net zero.



We have undertaken an audit of our current approaches and provision across seven areas — water usage, transport, grounds, buildings, food, energy use and consumption — to inform this plan. The initial draft primarily focuses on establishing good habits around, for example, resource and energy use in order to minimise waste and to cut costs. We also intend a re-invigoration of our pupil and student green teams and a review of our curriculum to ensure that we are developing the knowledge and skills that will serve our young people well in the future in relation to climate change.

We see this as a long-term commitment – a journey if you like that will involve all staff, pupils, students, trustees and parents over the coming years as we seek to become better informed and more sustainable in our outlook and practice. We will keep you posted along the way.

Opportunities and advice for employment, volunteering and university are regularly promoted via the website, within the <u>Sixth Form Noticeboard</u>.



For Parents - Should Your Child Have a Smartphone?

It's the big question that's been around for years, but there's no single answer that will fit every age, there's no single piece of advice that will fit every family dynamic.

For Parents - Pinterest Privacy and Safety Settings

Pinterest is an enormous and hugely popular platform. Known as a 'visual discovery engine' which basically means it is a user-to-user platform, meaning that individual users upload content for anyone else to see. You can use it for a variety of things to get ideas, create mood boards, scrapbooks and so much more. I use it myself for inspiration for my drawing projects.

But because it is user to user there will be content that isn't suitable for everyone. Back in 2022, during the inquest into the death of a 14 year old, even Pinterest admitted the <u>platform wasn't</u> safe.
