What is the PTFA and what does it do?

QEHS PTFA is a group of volunteer parents/carers, teachers and friends of the school who work together to make it an even better environment for children to learn in. The PTFA supports the school by raising money to enrich learning experiences for pupils. We fundraise through events and other activities. We also apply for grants for specific projects e.g. the outdoor gym. We have close ties with the school community, helping to connect school and home life, so parents/carers have opportunities to become more positively engaged with school as well as enjoying the social aspect of getting together with other parents while raising money for school.



The PTFA is run by a committee of parent volunteers, with support from Mr Seaton, Mrs Lloyd and several parent helpers. It is a Registered Charity, which the committee are Trustees of.

What kind of things might I be expected to do if I volunteer?

You could help us decide what activities we do and plan for the future at meetings or in our WhatsApp group, volunteering only as much time as you can reasonably give. For Parents - Roblox Update

As the most popular game on the planet with children, Roblox gets a lot of coverage and understandably so. It's an amazing platform to explore but it isn't without its faults, some of which are very significant.

In April 2025 Revealing Reality carried out an investigation into Roblox due to serious concerns of what children were experiencing within the game (link HERE). In September they carried out a follow-up investigation to see what, if anything had changed.

In short, quite a lot has changed, such as:

- Adjustments to content maturity ratings.
- ID verification for certain games and experiences.
- Stricter moderation
- Enhanced parental controls.

These are good but, according to Revealing Reality, they don't go far enough. There are still workarounds and very significant concerns. It's worth having a read of the full report which you can find **HERE**.
