

Through half-termly tuck shops, refreshment sales at events, their lottery, clothes collections and funding applications the group have achieved the following:

# **NCC Online safety session**

This year, Northumberland County Council are launching an online safety session aimed at parents and carers. The session will run on Wednesday, 26th November at 3.45 pm, Tuesday, 10th Feb at 7.30 pm, and Tuesday, 16th June 7.30 pm. The session includes

- What children get up to online at different ages.
- The four Cs helping us to assess and identify key risks.
- Actions parents can take to help keep their children safe online.
- Where parents can go for further information and support.

The session will take place online via a Microsoft Teams link, which will be sent to all parents in advance of each session. During the session, all cameras and mics will be turned off by default to ensure your privacy.

There will be an opportunity to ask questions via the chat facility. NCC will provide a handout at the end of the session, which is full of useful links and further information on key topics. Parents will be sent a link via email.

# For Parents by Alan Mackenzie, Online Safety Specialist - Shopping Scams

Every year hundreds of thousands of people here in the UK fall victim to fraud when buying something online. With Xmas and Xmas sales rapidly approaching, fraud and scams will be significantly on the increase.

GetSafeOnline has a plethora of information to help with this such as:

- Information on purchase scams <u>HERE</u>.
- Online buying tips <u>HERE</u>.
- Scam website checker **HERE**.

One piece of advice I couldn't see on either of these pages is related to the legitimacy of the company. Particularly on social media such as Instagram I will often see ads for things like clothing and gifts which look interesting and unique. When I click on the ad to take a closer look, I will always tap on the 3 dots on the top right and tap on "open in external browser." The reason for this is that if it is a company I'm not aware of, I want to know the details of the company before I purchase. Often when I go onto the website there are no company details, no contact details (apart from a web form), and either no reviews or perfect reviews. These are all red flags to me and I would never purchase from such a site.
