

The musicians who accompanied the show were outstanding—bringing energy, nuance and a level of musicianship that elevated the entire performance.

Productions of this scale only come to life through the dedication and expertise of many people, and I want to offer some special thanks. To **Jude Long**, whose direction shaped a powerful, moving, and beautifully crafted production; to **Clair Caris**, whose musical direction brought such richness and vibrancy to the score; and to **Kevin and Jo**, whose technical support ensured every light cue, soundscape and scene change landed with professional precision. Its themes—division, identity, belonging, and the urgent need for understanding across communities—are as resonant today as when the musical was written. Our students captured these ideas with maturity and sensitivity, reminding us of the power of the arts to reflect the world around us and to inspire change within it.

Why Being in Band 1 Matters

At QEHS, being in **Band 1 attendance (95% and above)** is one of the most important foundations for a student's success. Put simply, students who attend school every day are more likely to achieve their best academically, sustain strong friendships, feel confident in their learning, and make positive progress over time. Even small amounts of absence add up quickly—just one day a fortnight equates to a full week of lost learning over the school year.

Band 1 is our benchmark for *excellent* attendance. It reflects a pattern of reliability, readiness, and positive habits that set students up not only to thrive in school, but also to build the routines they will need for future education, training, and employment. By maintaining Band 1 attendance, students remain fully engaged with their lessons, benefit from consistent teaching, and stay connected with their peers and the wider life of the school.
